Zaccharie Risacher played a solid role with most of his minutes coming in the 4th quarter in helping his team maintain a big lead in their blowout win.

Offensively, Risacher did not move off the ball much, pretty complacent with simply spotting up in the corner, could possibly be due to his team's scheme as his team had 2 players spotted up in the corners on almost every offensive possession this game. He struggled to finish through minimal contact, he is very upright when moving so it created some awkward situations when he went up for finishes against similarly sized wings.

He has a very quick shot release, shoots it well off of off-ball movement, standing still, and off the dribble. His high release point and fluid motion make it easy for him to quickly get his shot off over any of the defenders guarding him in this game. A good example of Risacher's upside was at 4:25 of the 4th quarter; after getting a stop in the paint against a bigger player, Risacher pushed the fast break, swung the ball over to a player on the wing, and then quickly spotted up as the trailer for an open shot for a deep three. His playmaking was not very existent in the halfcourt as Risacher mostly spotted up in the corner or looked to create his own shot rather than create for his teammates. His display of knowing where to be, making the right plays on fast break opportunities, and finding ways to get open was at an adequate level in this game.

Defensively, Risacher showed some flashes but left a lot to be desired overall. He did not defend well in transition as he played the ball over aggressively leading to opposing players drawing fouls on him or blowing by him. He was willing to switch onto smaller guards and played hard, but his upright stance made it hard for him to keep up with them when they drove to the paint.
