The source was asked what is the most transferable skillset for Zaccharie Risacher? The source responded that the most transferable skillset for Risacher is his ability to shoot the three. He is really efficient. The source thinks that in the NBA right away, Risacher can score the three because he has the range and can shoot quickly, so the source thinks this is a skill Risacher can immediately transfer to the NBA level.

The source was asked how Risacher was being defended at the European professional level compared to how he will be defended on the NBA level? The source responded that in the NBA, Risacher will be defended by shorter guards like 2s or 3s. They will be able to put some pressure on him with physicality. They will be really low on their base. This is how they will defend him. In Europe, sometimes they put lots of 4 men and a tall guard too much of his size. The source doesn't view Risacher's size as a problem in the NBA. He has the ability to handle the ball and read some situations, which makes him a shooter guard. The source thinks Risacher will be matched by shorter, more physical and quicker guards. The source doesn't know if Risacher struggles against that because they don't face it a lot, but he is smart enough to avoid this pressure and is comfortable to play without the ball since he is a really good player off the ball. He will adjust with what the defense gives him.

The source was asked about his thoughts about Risacher's aggressiveness during games? The source responded that Risacher is a shy guy with people, but he is not shy on the court. He is aggressive and capable with just one dribble to finish above the rim. The source thinks Risacher will be more than efficient in this particular situation. He is not afraid to take three-point shots at all. Even when he was younger with the professional team when he came to practice, the first thing he did really well was not be afraid of the level of his opponent and just played like he used to play and the shots he took. He is not afraid to take shots, and the source thinks Risacher will be comfortable because with the NBA range and lack of people in the paint, he will have more space in the NBA to develop his game, especially his game off the dribble. He will be a more efficient at attacking the closeouts and driving when catching the ball so the source thinks that the NBA fits with Risacher's game.

The source was asked how he feels about Risacher's ability to perform under pressure and in big moments? The source responded that Risacher is still young so they don't know yet if Risacher is ready for this pressure for the attempts they have on him. The source said he would be able to know this better next season because, in the next season, there is more pressure before they are looking for what he is capable of doing. To answer this question, we have to wait one more year because he is too young

to know exactly if 2 seasons after he will be able to handle the pressure of the NBA. The source feels confident in Risacher's ability to develop it. He is talented, and a hard worker so the source is really confident about Risacher to progress and improve because he got everything to be a good player.

The source was asked how he feels about Risacher's physicality and if he's ready to play at the next level? The source responded that Risacher is ready to play at the next level because he is already taller than every guard even in the NBA. He is not NBA ready but close to being NBA ready. The source thinks Risacher will be more than ready physicality-wise to reach the level prior in the NBA. The adjustments the source would like to see Risacher make is to be lower on defense because he is tall it is difficult for him to guard really short combo guards who are really quick. He is capable to because he is a glue guy and has long arms but in the NBA level it is really hard for him to defend this type of player because it requires him to be really low on his legs. He is a good defender and is capable of guarding multiple positions, which are the 2, 3, and 4 positions. He is a glue guy and is always in contact with his player. He might struggle a bit with quick short guards, but overall defense is one of his strengths.

The source was asked what are Risacher's motives to play the game at the next level? The source responded that Risacher motives are more about his personality and his capacity to be mentally tough. He wants to express himself to show some aggression. He is a shy guy outside of hoops but with the ball in his hands, he is not shy at all.

The source was asked what kind of teammate Risacher is? The source responded that Risacher is a really good teammate because he is a type of player when you need something he is going to bring it for the team. He is a good guy so everybody likes him. There are no concerns about how he speaks with his teammates. He is a really good teammate, and everybody around him likes the player and the human being. The source doesn't consider Risacher as a leader because he is too young and they have a lot of veterans on their team. It is a prospect, and everybody appreciates his ability to be a good player, but for the moment he is not a leader. He would be a leader by example. He will show how to add because he has a good work ethic. He listens to the coach, he is a great teammate, he is a great player, and very coachable so he will lead by example. He is not a talkative guy and leader who will be able to speak with his teammate. He is not shy with his teammates. Outside the court he is shy, but he is a great guy so he talks with everybody, he is always enjoyable, and it is nice to be around him because he is a good guy.

The source was asked how is Risacher's ego and if he is coachable? The source responded that he doesn't see any bad ego so the source would consider Risacher as a really coachable player. He always answers when they talk to him and always listens so he is really coachable. All the people around him can appreciate the way he is really polite and a great kid. He accepts criticism from the coaching staff. When it is not agreed, he won't say anything, but he just lets things happen. He is a guy who, if he doesn't see the basket in the same way, then is just going to wait until he shows you on

the court or you change your mind, but he is not a guy who will go fight against you because he won't agree with what you say.

The source was asked how is Risacher's work ethics and if he does more than what is required? The source responded that Risacher is the first on the court in the beginning of practice or before the game and is the last at the end. He has got a really good work ethic. He is not a guy who works a lot without thinking. He is a smart worker. He used to take good advice from people who were really good, so the source views Risacher as smart with that.

The source was asked what is Risacher's level of basketball IQ and if he can carry over the scouting report to the court? The source responded that Risacher is a good listener and is coachable so he reads the scouting report. Sometimes he will ask the source questions about it, and if Risacher doesn't know something, he won't be afraid to ask a coach or the people with the coach. The source would say Risacher has a more than-average basketball IQ. It is really good. He is capable of handling the ball and playing pick and roll situations. He sees everything. The source thinks that Risacher will be one of the best in his position with the basketball IQ because he always is looking for everything. His high contact and court vision are really good so he will be more than average. The source hopes the scouting reports of LDLC ASVEL are at the same level as the NBA. They try to keep it simple and highlight the key information. They try to let the instinct of the player feel the player they will face in the game. The source tries to give key information like the tendencies, what opposing players like to do, and if they want to go to the left or on the right, which is the more important information for the player. The source knows the players don't read a book on the opponents before a game, so he tries to keep it simple but with a lot of highlights. If the guy is a really good pull-up mid-range shooter with his left-hand, the source will highlight this and mention this guard love to pull-up after a left dribble behind pick and roll to shoot a three. You have to be aware of this, and then he gives them the solution and the answer they want to give to stop the opposing player. He will mention the player likes to do this, so they will try to void him to go on his left and when he gets ball screens. This is the way they do the scouting report.

The source was asked how Risacher responds to in game adjustments? The source responded that Risacher responds to in game adjustments pretty well. He is coachable so if in a game you want to adjust and say maybe you should put more pressure on the ball or maybe you should adjust and step back because this guy doesn't shoot, then he responds pretty well and adjusts really quick. He is going to ask the coach if they want something different during the game and then he will adjust to maybe physically, crash the boards harder, or do something else to help the team.

The source was asked what will be one reason Risacher will be successful and one reason he will not be successful at the next level? The source responded that one reason Risacher will be successful at the next level is his basketball skills because he can do whatever you want. He can shoot, drive, post-up in mismatch situations, play pick and roll, play as a 1,2, 3, and maybe 4 if you want to. The source thinks Risacher's

best ability is his skills being limitless. These particular skills and his ability will have him to be a success in a higher level. On the other end we got a lot of weak players in the world, so you have to be one of a kind. You have to be someone and show something unthinkable for the NBA. He should show his emotion and talk more on the court to be remembered.

The source was asked if Risacher ever failed a drug test? The source responded that Risacher has never failed a drug test. He would never and isn't that type of guy.

The source was asked if there are any personal and social red flags for Risacher? The source responded that there are no personal and social red flags for Risacher.

The source was asked how is Risacher's competitive level in practice and does he push others? The source responded that Risacher is a competitor. He does not push the others because he is a little bit quiet, but he doesn't want to lose so every time they have a game during the practice, he does everything to win the game and you can see it when you watch his face. He is really committed to win, and he does whatever it takes to win.
