Jaylon Tyson showcased an ability to score off the dribble, attacking the basket and getting to his spots on the floor. He will also show his ability to play make and will have a couple plays that stood out in this area. First play will be at the 12:14 mark in the first half as he brings the ball up in transition, sends a no look pass to his rim running big for assist. The next play will be around the 15:44 mark in the second half as Jaylon drives towards the rim and sends a pocket pass to a teammate that was cutting back door. Jaylon will end the game with 14 points and 4 assist on 6/14 shooting from the field and 1/4 from 3pt. Despite having 4 assists in this game, he will still be aggressively looking to score throughout this game, attacking the rim through contact, and taking shots off the dribble. He will take a few that will seem to be forced shots.

Defensively, Jaylon Tyson displayed his ability as an off-ball defender both in the half court and in transition. Jaylon will have a play that stood out in the final seconds of the first half, and he will hustle back in transition, then jump to steal a lob pass prevent a score before half. Jaylon will end the game with 2 steals and 6 rebounds. He will have a solid defensive showing, not too many things that will stand out or to note that happened.

While Jaylon Tyson showcased his ability to score off the dribble, his ball handling will be loose at times in this game. He will end the game with 3 turnovers, but I noticed he will like to attack in crowds and he can tend to over dribble trying to break down his defender.
